Re: Permission to Waive Late Fees

I am writing to request permission to waive the late fee associated with tax parcel 104-1-68. This parcel was recently purchased by Mr. Jorge Sanchez-Lara. As you can see from the attached tax bill, the name of the previous owner is still shown.

We received a check from the bank in the amount of \$783.14 for the tax bill prior to the June 30th deadline. Unfortunately, this was the wrong amount (it was last year's amount). Not having the correct name of the owner and not having the correct amount, I was unable to determine which property this tax payment was for.

Mr. Sanchez-Lara also owns another property in the Village. I could see that his tax bill for that property was paid. I called the Water Clerk and she said that there was no outstanding balance on his water account. I therefore returned the check to Mr. Sanchez-Lara with a note saying that it appeared his tax bill was paid in full already.

Meanwhile, I sent two follow-up tax bills to Mr. Robert Decotiis, the previous owner of this parcel, about the unpaid tax bill for this property. It was only recently that Mr. Decotiis contacted Mr. Sanchez-Lara to tell him that the tax bill for the second parcel owned by Mr. Decotiis was still outstanding. That's when all the pieces fell into place and Mr. Sanchez-Lara realized what had happened. He contacted me immediately.

I am asking the Board to waive the late fee penalty for this property because it was, in fact, paid in time, just for the wrong amount. The mistake was not Mr. Sanchez-Lara's, it was the bank's as the check came directly from them. The payment was only \$22.88 short. The penalty at this point is just \$54.16, which I believe is below the threshold for water accounts.

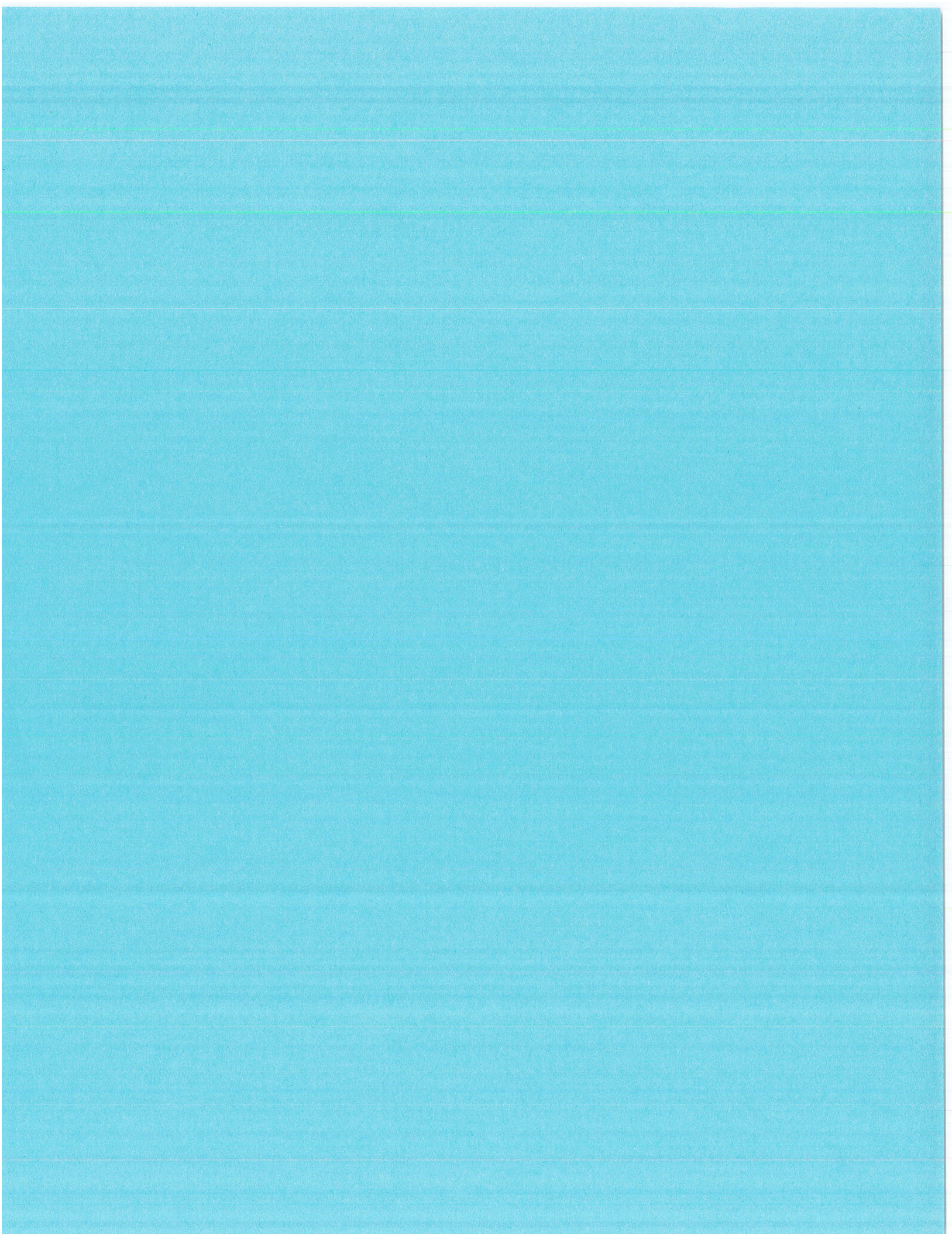

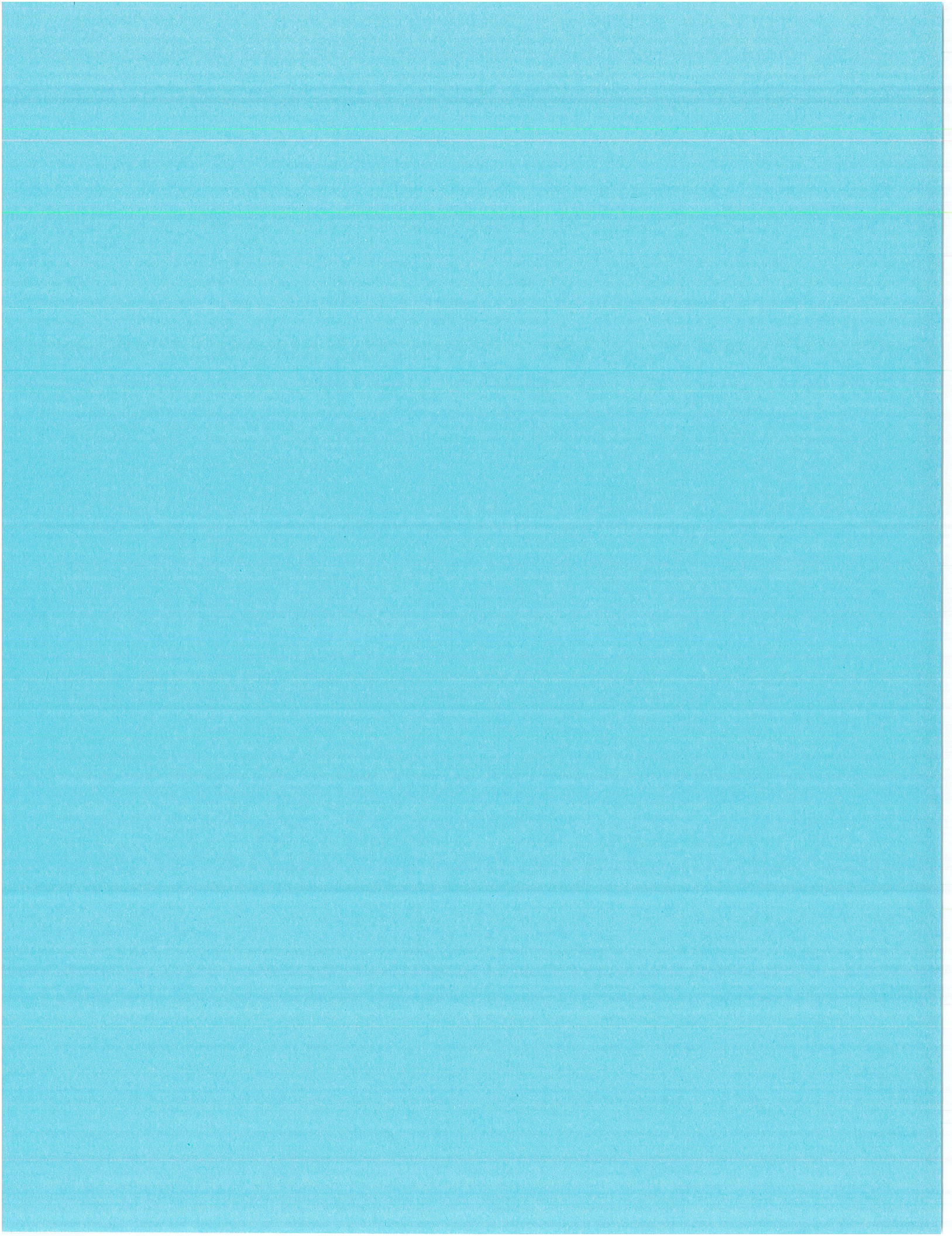

LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 2021

VILLAGE OF TUXEDO PARK

**A LOCAL LAW OPTING OUT OF ALLOWING RETAIL CANNABIS DISPENSARIES
AND ON-SITE CANNABIS CONSUMPTION ESTABLISHMENTS WITHIN THE
VILLAGE OF TUXEDO PARK**

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Tuxedo Park, Orange County, New York as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

It is the intent of this local law to opt the Village of Tuxedo Park out of hosting retail cannabis dispensaries and/or on-site cannabis consumption establishments within its boundaries.

Section 2. Authority.

This local law is adopted pursuant to the provisions of NYS Cannabis Law § 131, which expressly authorizes villages to opt-out of permitting retail cannabis dispensaries and/or on-site cannabis consumption establishments to locate and operate within their boundaries.

Section 3. Local Cannabis Retail Dispensary and/or On-Site Consumption Opt-Out

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Tuxedo Park, County of Orange, hereby opts-out of licensing and establishing cannabis dispensaries and cannabis on-site consumption establishments within Village Boundaries.

Section 4. SEQRA.

The adoption of this Local Law is a Type II Action under SEQRA regulations.

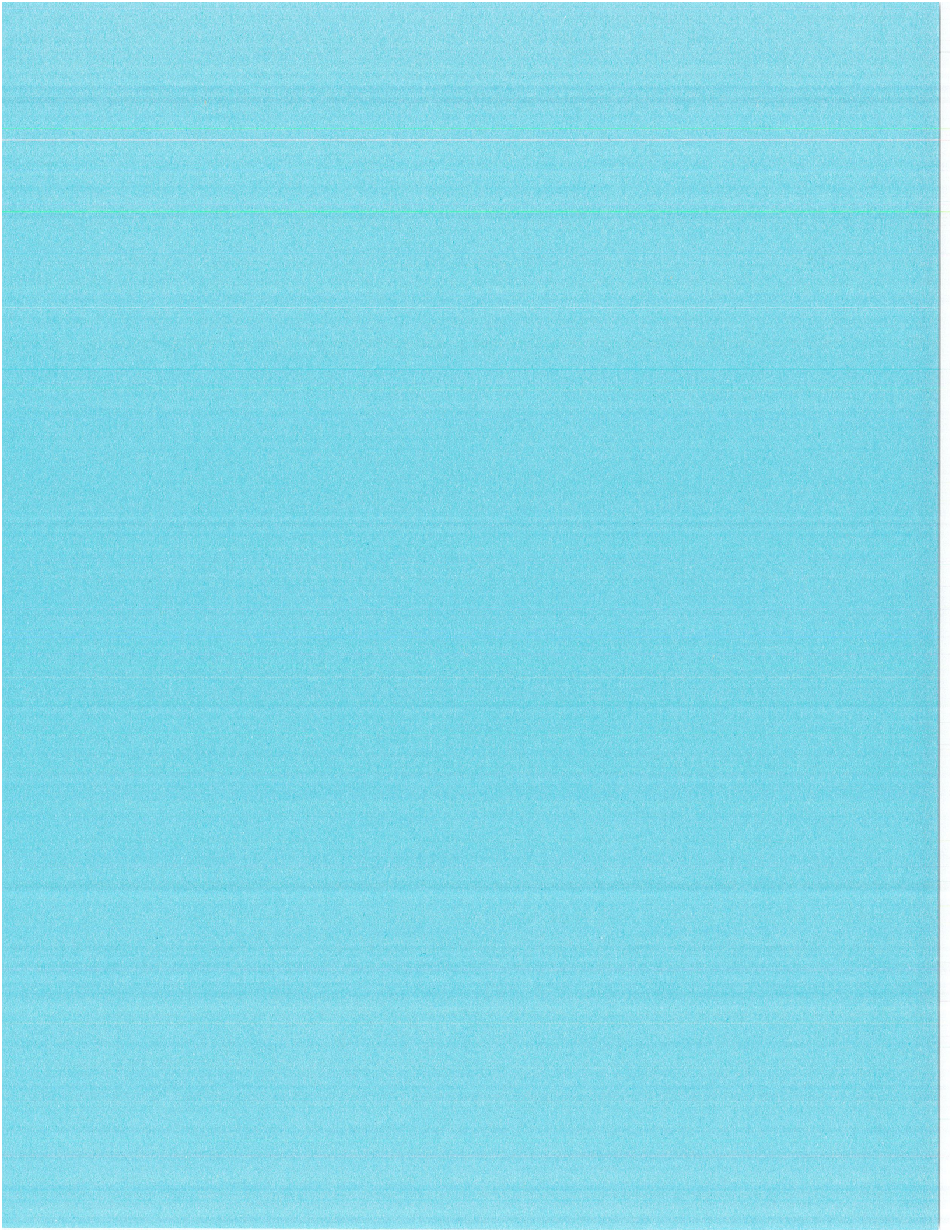
Section 5. Severability.

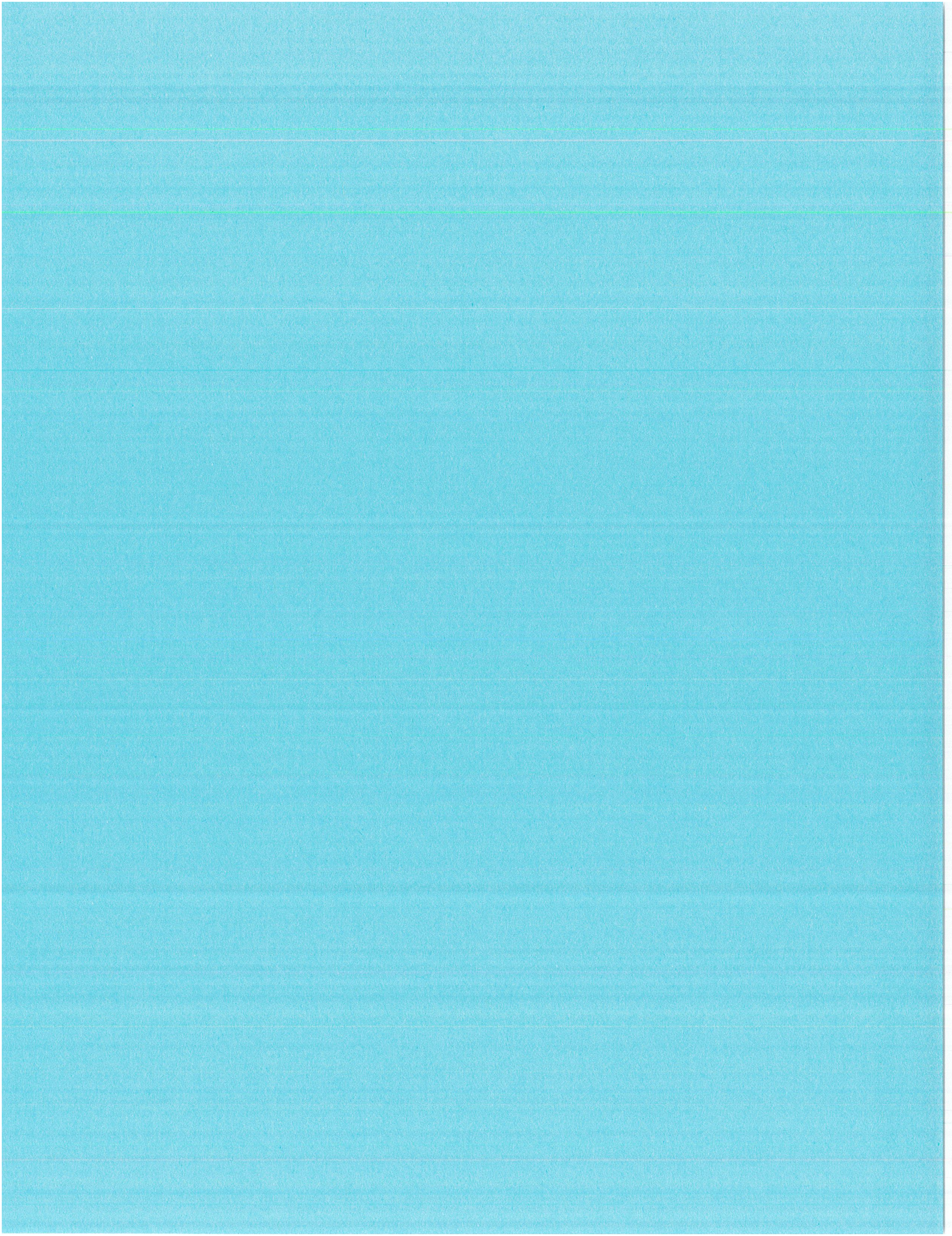
If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm, or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 6. Effective date.

This local law shall be effective immediately upon the filing with the Secretary of State. Pursuant to NYS Cannabis Law § 131, this Local Law is subject to a permissive referendum and

thus may not be filed with the Secretary of State until the applicable time period has elapsed to file a petition or the referendum has been conducted and approves this local law.

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) into law, which included \$774 million from the federal Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (CLFRF) for certain cities, towns and villages in New York State. The State Division of the Budget (DOB) is responsible for allocating these funds in accordance with the Act and the rules and guidance of the U.S. Department of the Treasury. The Office of the State Comptroller (OSC) began processing these payments to local governments in July 2021.

Here is some additional information about your ARPA CLFRF payment:

ARPA CLFRF funds for Non-Entitlement Units (NEU) of local government that were either not requested or were declined by those local governments have been reallocated by DOB to eligible NEU recipients. We have processed an additional payment in the amount of \$125.11 for your Village. Receipt of this reallocation payment represents the final "first tranche" ARPA CLFRF payment. Eligible municipalities should expect to receive second tranche payments in the summer of 2022 pursuant to U.S. Department of the Treasury guidance.

If you receive a larger payment than indicated above, it is because the Statewide Financial System (SFS) combines all payments due to you, including those from other programs. Additional payment details are also available by accessing your SFS Vendor Portal account at <https://esupplier.sfs.ny.gov>. If you are having trouble logging into your Vendor Portal account, please contact the Statewide Financial System Helpdesk at 518-457-7717 or HelpDesk@sfs.ny.gov.

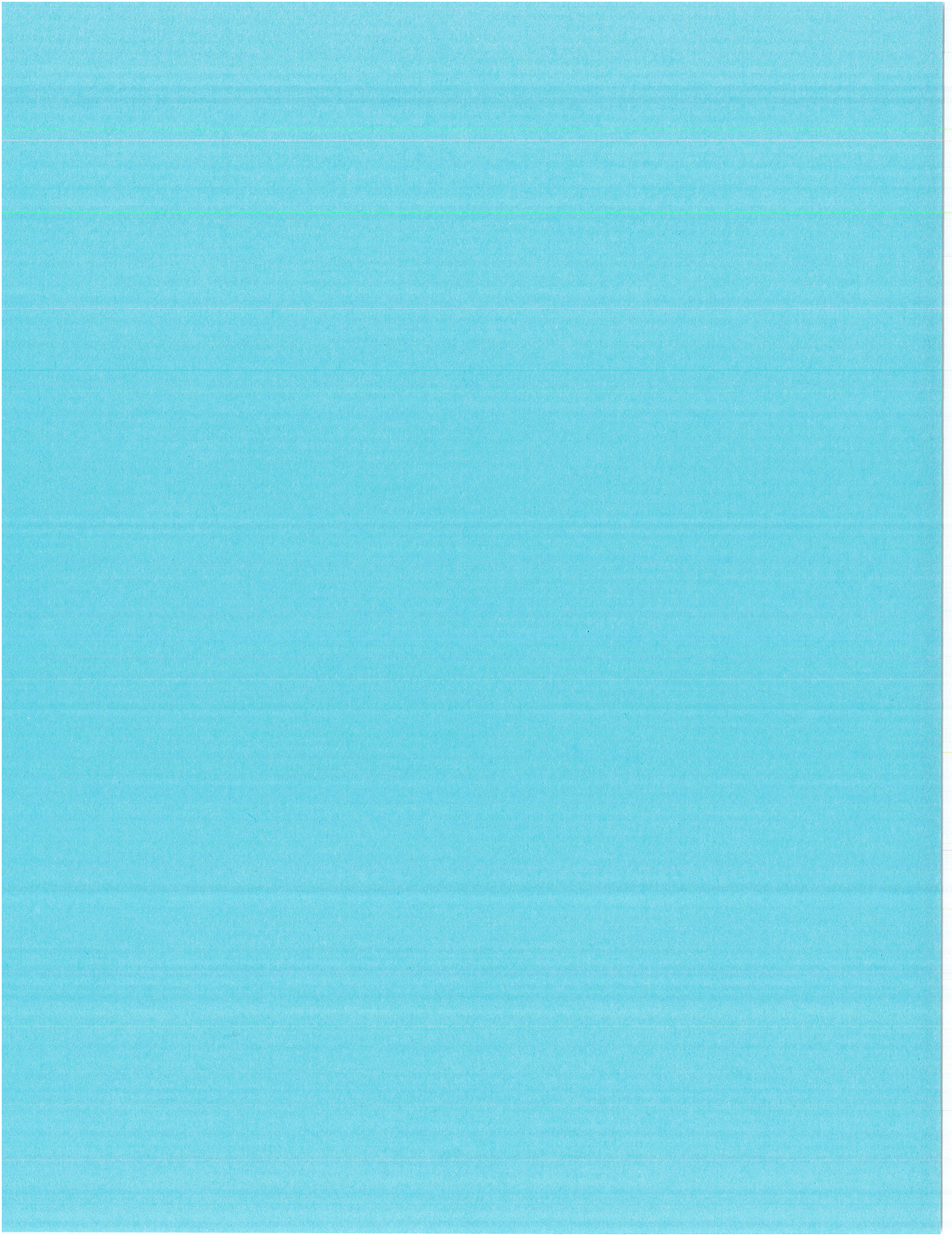

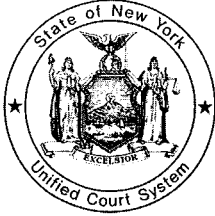
