Description:

The terrace adjoining the west wall of the West Loggia and the north wall of the Garden Room is sunken in places, has lost any pitch there may have been, and is causing severe leaking into the entire length of the Game Room and the northwest corner of the Cellar underneath. The water is coming in behind the entire length of the wooden paneling of the Game Room and into the cork lined ceiling of the Cellar.

According to the different experts we consulted, the present surface of the terrace was put in about 15 years ago using low grade pavers made of red colored cement.

Rather than re-instating these kinds of pavers, we would prefer to use the same Tennessee Crab Orchard Flagstone, exactly the same in quality, pattern, grout color, as seen on the Main Terrace as well as in the East Loggia (originally conceived as an exterior space).

We have found evidence in numerous references dated from circa 1930 that this space was indeed covered in Tennessee Crab Orchard.


